

Washington 2005 Statewide Smoking Ban I-901

Contributor Information

Washington Public Disclosure Commission's (PDC) Form C4 filings disclose that as of November 1, 2005 proponents of I-901 (Healthy Indoor Air for All Washington) raised \$1,560,666 in cash and in-kind donations (see page 4), while as of October 31, 2005 opponents (No On I-901) raised \$26,340 (see page 5).

The information tables presented below are based on the database of individual contributions to I-901 stored in WA PDC spread sheet format as of November 15, 2005. That database showed \$1,405,661 in cash donations and in-kind donations valued at \$175,541, for a total of \$1,581,202.

There is a small variance between the totals provided below and totals on WA PDC Form C4 summary data, due to Form C4 being filed for the previous month and spread sheet data continuing into November 2005.

1. Six (6) contributors donated more than \$50,000 in cash to I-901:

a.) Together, the above six major contributors to I-901 account for 77.0 percent of cash donations, 87.2 percent of in-kind donations, and 78.2 percent of total donations to I-901.

b.) All of the above six major contributors have home headquarters outside the State of Washington.

c.) None of the above six major contributors conduct the majority of their business activities, or derive the majority of their revenues, inside the State of Washington.

d.) The above six major contributors to I-901 represent five special-interest advocacy groups that have received grant funding from and/or have ties to the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation of Princeton, New Jersey and a self-service laundry facility that now benefits from a tax exemption for self-service laundry revenues in the State of Washington passed during the 2005 legislative year (see Washington Substitute House Bill 2314 2005, Part I.)

e.) In-kind donations from the above contributors included staff services, voter outreach, purchasing domain names, hosting forums, printing and distribution of voter cards, salaries, and mileage (see page 6 of this report.)

f.) It is safe to say that absent the cash and in-kind contributions from the above six organizations I-901 would not have qualified for the November 2005 ballot in Washington, nor would I-901 have had available the infrastructure necessary to organize voter outreach efforts and public advertising to assure a majority vote for I-901.

2. One (1) political party contributed to I-901, the Washington State Democrat Central Committee.

a.) That central committee provided \$10,362 of in-kind donations.

b.) Those donations include providing access to voter lists and E-Mail services, an overt endorsement of I-901.

c.) \$1,246,525 (78.8 percent) of total donations to I-901 are accounted for by adding contributions from the Washington State Democrat Central Committee to the list of six major contributors.

d.) I-901 is uniquely tied to and associated with the Washington Democrat party, as is the 60 cents per pack increase in cigarette taxes passed by the Democrat controlled Washington House and Senate during the 2005 legislative year (see Washington Substitute House Bill 2314 2005, Part XI.)

a.) Each of the above individuals or groups have a professional or business interest in I-901 passing.

b.) When adding this amount to preceding totals \$1,269,285 (80.3 percent) of donations to I-901 are accounted for. Just 6 major contributors, 1 political party, and 9 advocates account for 80 percent of all donations to I-901.

a.) When adding the above sum to previous totals \$1,418,285 (89.7 percent) of all cash and in-kind donations to I-901 are accounted for.

b.) Based on the above data it is fair to say that 90 percent of donations to I-901 came from just 31 individuals or organizations that have a professional or business interest in I-901 passing.

a.) When adding the final list of 18 that contributed more than \$1,000 to I-901 we arrive at \$1,518,535 (96.0 percent) of total contributions accounted for.

Based on the foregoing it is fair to say that I-901 was most certainly an Initiative TO the People. A mere sixty-five (65) advocacy groups, medical service providers, professional associations, and private donors are the source of \$1,518,535 (96.0 percent) of funding for I-901. Those 65 individuals and organizations clearly spoke their minds to the people as to what must be done about state law that affects more than 6 million Washington residents. Money talks, it worked!
